

# Getting Along and Having Fun – The NAF Code of Conduct

Life at NAF is fun and exciting, and what helps it to be this way is the way in which our campers get along and behave. We don't have a ton of rules at NAF but like anywhere else, we must have certain guidelines that we follow to make life better for everyone. Here at NAF there are only three groups of guidelines and rules you'll need to remember; guidelines concerning **you**, how you **get along** with and treat others, and **campus life**.

## **CAMPERS**

As a camper at NAF, the things you do each day and the way that you act make a big difference in the NAF experience for every camper. Each camper is expected to be completely honest. Campers should follow the daily schedule and help when they are assigned to help. You will be expected to get up at the scheduled time each morning and to turn the lights out at the appropriate time at night. Campers are also expected to stay on task during activities and to give their best effort.

We do have a dress code at camp. Tank tops are allowed, but the bra must be covered. Do not bring spaghetti strap tank tops, excessively short shorts, or tube tops. Don't worry...there will be plenty of time at the lake and pool when you will get tan!

## **GETTING ALONG**

Nothing makes life easier than getting along each day with those around you. At NAF we expect you to be on good behavior. No camper will use profanities or obscene gestures, including the use of the words "Lord" or "God" in a profane way, as it is offensive to some. Each camper should respect the other campers, staff members, and their personal property. No camper will use name calling or teasing to degrade another camper or staff member, and everyone is encouraged to use positive and polite language. Campers are also expected to listen and follow the instruction and counsel of their coaches and other leaders.

## **CAMPUS LIFE**

Don't sweat it...there are just a few things to remember. Campers cannot leave the campus except on group outings or with their parents, and they must stay with the group and not go off on their own. The E-mail, Internet, and telephone may be used with permission and during designated times. TV and movies may be viewed only during designated or free times.

Each camper is expected to take their turn helping with the preparation and clean up of meals. Campers are also expected to follow the Kitchen Rules. Some of these rules are; eating only during the scheduled meal and snack times, selecting a fruit or vegetables for snacks, and using manners while eating. The kitchen is off limits outside of scheduled eating and snack times.

Campers are also expected to make their bed each morning and to keep their room clean...no messy rooms here! Sorry girls, no more than 5 minutes in the shower – we have so many fun activities planned each day that there won't be time for longer showers. We want to spend the day playing instead of getting ready to play!

**One last rule...**all campers are expected to have fun, make friends, lose weight, and have a blast!
